Durable Medical Equipment (DME) Providers

Type of diagnosis codes used:	ICD
Type of procedure codes used:	HCPCS
Prior approvals affected by ICD-10?	Yes
Claims affected by ICD-10?	Yes
Special considerations for this provider type:	DME Claims with dates of service that span October 1 do not have to be split. (For example, diabetic testing supplies.) Providers should use the "From" date of service (DOS) to determine which ICD code set to use in billing. Claims with a "From" date of service prior to October 1 should use ICD-9 diagnosis codes. Claims with a "From" date of service on or after October 1 should use ICD-10 diagnosis codes. Prior approvals do not need to be split, unless for DPH (Sickle Cell or EHDI.)
